

"I feel like it's a breach on the students' personal freedom and it honestly just makes me really uncomfortable." Norton said.

Norton feels as though the revamped surveillance system will unrealistically force students to be on their best behavior at all times. "Honestly I feel like the more that they treat us like kids the more we are going to act like them. So I think if they expect respect they should respect us as well," Norton said.

There is a possibility that the cameras do not actually last as long as many are worrying about. "I think there will be a lot of parent concern raised and especially student concern, it's probably going to cause more problems than solve," Norton said. Because it will be hard for staff, teachers and students to reach a consensus, the administration may revoke the cameras and approach the new issues with new solutions.

Parent concern is a very valid argument; one one hand, there are those who do not want their children to be recorded. On the other hand, some parents do not mind the advanced form of monitoring, it may give students a chance to have their positive actions captured as well.

"There's a repeating pattern with each school year becoming more and more troublesome, so it would make sense to try and crack down on these issues," Norton said.

Regardless of the regulations and the route the school ends up taking, parents want their students to feel safe in their learning environment and also engaged. It is important to explore the ramifications these cameras might have on students' capabilities in the classroom.

Eighth-Graders' Invasion

Eighth-grade students from SPMS are allowed to take courses at SPHS.

Beginning in the 2024-25 school year, Severna Park Middle School's eighth grade class will be allowed to attend classes at Severna Park High School in order to combat teacher shortages and budget cuts throughout Anne Arundel County Public Schools. Severna Park High School has been chosen as a test school to determine if this method can be implemented throughout the county.

Due to SPHS's size, there is space to accommodate about 200 additional students, which is about half the size of an average class size. Classes that are subject to accepting eighth grade students include (but are not limited to) Algebra 1, Chinese 1, Spanish 1 and French 1.

Originally, the middle schoolers were going to take the high school bus to school in the morning but due to preexisting space constraints, the county opted for having a bus available for the students to use. The buses will leave from the middle school at 11:20 and upon arrival, they will be distributed to their scheduled class. If they only take one class, they will be able to have a study hall for one period and then all of the eighth graders will be allowed back to the middle school.

In order to be eligible for this program, the middle schoolers must have a weighted GPA of at least 3.0 and must have parental approval.

Roxanne Angerer, a math teacher at Severna Park High School who teaches Algebra 1 students, is excited for this

"High school students take college classes early, so it works the same way, and prepares the middle schooler," Angerer said, "The classes will expand however, but this is something I'm willing to accommodate because at one point I even had 52 total desks in my class."

Angerer thinks that this change will help to solve the

"I'd still teach Spanish but I'd transition to being fully Italian. I hear that teaching them and learning them because kids might have backgrounds in Spanish or French, they might find themselves doing surprisingly well in another language and maybe even scoring really high in APs. Lots of fives," Sneck said.

Clearly, the county's Board of Education agrees

Clearly, the county's Board of Education agrees with Sneck due to the implementation of these languages at such a late stage for teenagers developmentally. Auchincloss believes students will actually excel in these new courses.

"Our Falcons can do it. Anyone who tells them otherwise is lowering expectations. Colleges are looking for students who rise to challenges, not the easy way out," Auchincloss said.

"I think we probably have to offer level 1A and 1B in all languages and possibly level two at the middle school. So kids could come here and take level three," Sneck said.

Truly a viable solution to the late-stage implementation argument, kids can start learning a new language even earlier than just in high school. Most of the language teachers believed it would be productive to teach these five new languages at the middle school as well.

"I think that Senora Bak would maybe teach Russian, Mrs. Auchincloss could do Italian, I think that maybe Mrs. Fernandez-Sanchez might be able to do Japanese and possibly even the Greek language," Sneck said.

To better fill the WLC hallway and get students learning a language throughout all four years: a proposal that "maybe we'd have five more teachers," Sneck said.




